MINUTES WEST VIRGINIA UNIVERSITY AT PARKERSBURG BOARD OF GOVERNORS April 10, 2012

A regular meeting of the West Virginia University at Parkersburg Board of Governors was held on Tuesday, April 10, 2012 in the College Theatre at the WVU Parkersburg campus beginning at 5:30 p.m. Board members present were: Joe Campbell, Matthew Santer, Violet Mosser, Jamie Six, Curtis Miller, Cindy Bullock, Steve Chancey, Loren Bell, Rock Wilson, Greg Smith, Cheryl Donohoe, and Gerard El Chaar. Others present included Dr. Marie Foster Gnage and Patsy Bee.

Guests present included administrators, faculty, staff, students, Delegate Anna Border, and members of the media.

I. Call to Order

Mr. Campbell, Chair of the WVU at Parkersburg Board of Governors, called the meeting to order.

II. Roll Call

Roll Call was taken by Patsy Bee, Executive Assistant to the President, noting that a quorum was present with only one board member absent.

III. Board Chair Report

Mr. Campbell thanked Board members for attending the day long retreat. He also welcomed Delegate Border and thanked her for coming and for her support during this year's Legislative Session. He reported that the Board met with members of the National Guard in an information session during the Retreat, and the next step will be to meet with stakeholders and representatives from the college to discuss securing funding for the project. Some user groups will be convened to get input from the community for the initial design. He explained that General Hoyer noted that there is some money available for the architectural design. The college may begin to use the Millwood Armory in Jackson County.

On another matter, Mr. Campbell reported that he, President Gnage and Jamie Six met with WVU President Dr. Jim Clements and some of his Cabinet members regarding the agreement between WVU and WVUP. There will be follow up with them in the next few weeks.

Mr. Campbell reported that he would like for the Faculty Salary Taskforce to meet as soon as possible so a recommendation can be scheduled on the Board agenda for the next meeting.

IV. President's Report

President Gnage thanked the Board for spending the day on campus, and for their continued support to the college. She also thanked Delegate Border for attending today, and extended her appreciation to the entire Legislative delegation for their support in making sure that transition funding was secured for WVU Parkersburg again this year. She noted that Delegate Anderson fervently led the efforts on the House side and Senator Boley, the Senate.

Next, President Gnage introduced Ms. Lisa Flowers-Clements who provided an update to the Board from the Faculty Senate.

V. Approval of Minutes

Minutes of the regular Board meeting scheduled on February 8 meeting was approved upon a motion by Mr. Smith and second by Mr. El Chaar.

VI. Committee Reports

Executive Committee:

Mr. Campbell reported that the Executive Committee met this morning at 8:00 a.m. to review the Board agenda and receive information on some other college issues.

Administrative Services Committee:

Mr. Miller reported that the Committee reviewed updates from Facilities area on the Applied Technology Center, Child Development Center, Downtown Center, the new Energy Lab, and an update on the HVAC in the College Activities Center. Business Services provided an update on the new ERP and E-Refund Initiative with ECSI. Human Resources reported that there are currently 18 positions open. WVUP is working with Workforce Investment Board to secure On-The-Job Training funds, Performance Management – Classified and Non-Classified training on Pay-for-Performance Process, and SB330. Information Technology provided an update on the wiring project.

Academic Committee:

Ms. Bullock reported that Academic Affairs provided an update on retention, the summer bridge program, online course/program report, and faculty positions. Workforce and Community Education provided an update on Fast Track Programs, Correctional Center Education, Community Education, Professional Development for their staff, WorkKeys and Business and Industry Training. Student Services provided an update on review of Threat Assessment Procedures, Enrollment report, Initial response to Affordable Tuition Policy, and Riverhawk Athletic Club.

BACKGROUND:

WVU Parkersburg is seeking approval for a new Associate of Applied Science in Surgical Technology. This program of study falls under the already-approved Associate of Applied Science and is an addition of a program of study only. The college has offered a certificate in Surgical Technology for over ten years; however, the number of hours required for completion as required for an accredited program exceed the new state requirement ceiling of 30 credit hours. As a result, the program has been enhanced and expanded to meet the requirements of the next degree at the associate level with 60 credit hours. This move to a higher degree level is the result of recent WVCTCS state guidelines, recent Higher Learning Commission (HLC) guidelines, and the findings of the recent Surgical Technology program accreditation visit.
