



Title: #V-17. Credit Articulation with Other Institutions

Date: March 28, 2001 (replaces version dated May 29, 1990)

West Virginia University at Parkersburg will recognize vocational or technical training completed at certain other institutions and grant appropriate credit to students who have completed such training, as follows:

RESA V Vocational Schools. WVUP maintains articulation agreements with the four state vocational schools located in Regional Educational Service Area V of the State of West Virginia and, in certain instances, with vocational schools in other RESA jurisdictions and with public high schools. Students who complete curricula outlined in such articulation agreements will be eligible to receive college credit after they have enrolled at WVUP. Vocational schools or high schools will provide verification that students have fulfilled requirements outlined in articulation agreements, and the Registrar will list articulated credit on a student's official transcript after that student has completed at least 12 hours' credit in courses numbered above 100 at WVUP with a cumulative grade-point average of 2.0 or higher.

Other State Vocational Schools. Students entering WVUP after completing vocational training at state vocational schools in other RESA jurisdictions may be eligible to receive articulated vocational credit as a result of that training. Certain restrictions apply. (1) The vocational school in which a student completed training must have a valid articulation agreement in effect with a state college located in the RESA district in which the vocational school is located; (2) A copy of the articulation agreement must be filed together with verification that the student has fulfilled all obligations outlined in that agreement; and (3) the request for credit must be reviewed by the appropriate Division Chair (or his or her designee), and the Division Chair shall verify appropriate credit to the Registrar. Such credit may be added to the student's transcript only after the student has completed a minimum of 12 credit hours in courses numbered above 100 at WVUP with a cumulative grade-point average of 2.0 or higher.

Police Academies. Students entering the WVU at Parkersburg Criminal Justice program who have previously completed training at any police academy or any state authorized correctional academy may request credit for entry-level courses in Criminal Justice. In each case, the following restrictions shall apply: (1) verification of completion of training must be presented by the student; (2) the Coordinator of the Criminal Justice program must review the student's performance at any police academy or correctional academy and must conclude the level of college credit which can be granted, based upon the hours of training, the fields of training, and the levels of achievement; (3) the Coordinator's recommendations on credit must be reviewed and approved by the Division Chair; and (4) the Division Chair must send recommendations for credit to the Registrar. Credit may be added to the student's transcript only after the student has completed a minimum of 12 credit hours in courses numbered above 100 at WVU at Parkersburg with a cumulative grade-point average of 2.0 or higher.
