Course EDUC 253 Trauma Informed Practices

Catalog Course Description: This course provides an overview of trauma and social emotional learning. Teacher candidates will be introduced to the effects of trauma, adverse childhood experiences, and social emotional learning. Teacher candidates will explore how trauma can affect instruction within the K-6 setting. Strategies to support positive mental health will be introduced along with self-care practices and the effects of secondary trauma.

EDUC 253 introduces students to trauma informed practices in the K-6 classroom. Teacher candidates will use the pillars of *Architects of the Future* (planning, teaching

skills, interpersonal skills, decision making skills, professional commitment, and diversity), to connect the impact of trauma on K-6 students to effective trauma informed practices and the social emotional learning framework that can be used in the classroom. Self-care for educators and resiliency strategies are also addressed. All six program learning outcomes will be assessed through the culminating project, a Social Emotional Learning Plan and Presentation.
