Catalog Course Description: A strategies course designed to prepare teacher candidates to integrate the arts and movement into their daily classroom instruction. This course will focus on the study of art, music, and movement appropriate for elementary students.

- 2. The instructor will need to complete the Planning Assessment Rubrics in LiveText based on a collection of lesson plans created in the required unit.
- 3. Students will incorporate technology in the design of lesson plans to be used in their classrooms.
- 4. Students will need to have a current Livetext (or affiliate) subscription and use Blackboard for
