Education:

Experience:

- Minimum of five (5) years recent scrub experience, or five (5) years recent experience as an instructor in surgical technology, or a combination of both, within the past (10) years.
- OR equivalent of Education and Experience

Licensure:

- Current NCCA-approved credential in surgical technology (CST, CSFA, or CST/CSFA).
- Preferred: Successful college-level teaching experience is preferred, as well as prior effective use of technology in instructional delivery, and a willingness to deliver courses in all instructional modalities.
- Strongly preferred: Understanding and application of assessment practices.

25%	Program Administration Assists the dean with the overall administration of the SurgTech program This includes developing and implementing procedures and guidelines for the program, ensuring compliance with regulatory requirements and maintaining accreditation standards.
20%	Instructor Instruct a reduced faculty load as needed of theory and clinical skills
15%	Quality Assurance Responsible for monitoring the quality of the SurgTech program by conducting regular evaluations, assessments, and reviews. Identifies areas for improvement and implements strategies to enhance program quality. Responsible for preparing reports that demonstrate compliance with accreditation standards. Responsible for compiling and analyzing data related to student performance, faculty qualifications, program outcomes, and other evaluation criteria.
15%	Faculty Management Assists the dean by overseeing the recruitment and evaluation of SurgTech faculty members. Provides guidance and support to faculty, promotes professional development opportunities, and ensures that faculty members are qualified and competent to deliver quality education. Responsible for evaluating faculty performance by conducting faculty evaluation and prepares reports that assess teaching effectiveness, scholarly activities, professional development, and adherence to program procedures.
10%	Curriculum Development Assists the dean by collaborating with faculty members to develop and review the SurgTech curriculum. This involves assisting the faculty with designing courses, establishing learning objectives, and ensuring that the curriculum aligns with current nursing standards and best practices.
10%	Clinical Placement, Collaboration and Outreach Responsible for collaborating with healthcare institutions and clinical agencies to secure clinical placement opportunities for SurgTech students. This involves coordinating clinical rotations and ensuring that the student receive appropriate clinical experiences. Responsible for fostering relationships with external stakeholders, such as healthcare organization and regulatory bodies.
