WVU Parkersburg is committed to offering the highest quality and most affordable higher education in the region.

Who can attend WVU Parkersburg?

Our college is an *open enrollment institution*, accepting of *any secondary education* completion recognized by the State of West Virginia. You *do not have to take specific secondary courses* to gain admission to WVU Parkersburg.

How Do I Apply?

The college application process is completely free. Visit www.wvup.edu/apply and follow the on screen instructions.

What Do I Send to WVU Parkersburg?

Homeschool students can confirm the completion of a state recognized homeschool program in the following ways:

- A transcript or diploma of secondary course work certified as complete and meeting the standards of secondary school completion for the State of West Virginia and signed by the student's Home School Administrator (*often a parent of the student*) as detailed in West Virginia Code 18-8-1 subsection (c).

And,

- Proof the Home School Administrator is recognized by the local school district. A document from the county school district in which the student was resident at the time of secondary school completion showing the transcript or diploma was signed by a person recognized as a Home School Administrator (often the parent). This document is often issued in the student's *11th grade year*.

Homeschool applicants to WVU Parkersburg *are not required* to provide ACT, SAT or any other placement or entrance test.

Homeschool applicants are strongly encouraged to complete a scholarship application at www.wvup.edu/finaid and select **Application** near the top of the page.
